

Navy Tops Penn in Track

ANNAPOLIS—Navy's indoor track team won seven events in a 63-55 victory over Pennsylvania tonight.

Midshipman Daryl Anderson led a Navy sweep in the 600, 1:13.0. He was followed by Jeff Colvin and Bruce Prutzman. The victory gives the Navy track team a 10-1 record in six meets.

Other winners for the Midshipmen included Claude Barron, who posted his best time of the season in the 2-mile run, 8:52.4; Eli Turner with a 6.3 in the 60-yard dash; Tony Campbell with :07.3 in the 60-yard high hurdles; and Mike Sears, who won the triple jump, 45-9.
