Sal Corrallo of Gaithersburg won the Potomac Valley Walkers 10 mile racewalk yesterday on the Carter Rock towpath. Corrallo finished with a time of two hours 34 minutes 42 seconds, 30 seconds ahead of Tom Hamilton of Arlington. Paul Robertson of Oxon Hill was third in 2:54,23.
