Norm Gordon of Fairfax won the Camper's Classic 10 kilometer (6.2 miles) foot race yesterday in Vienna. Gordon's time was 32 minutes, 6 seconds.

Alan Hinchliffe of Reston was second in 32:30, followed by Tom Kurahara of Vienna, 36:21. Patricia Patrick of Fairfax was the fastest woman, 42:30. Eric Stroechele of Vienna won the two-mile race in 13:12.
